Composer, Conductor, Performer of score for Andrew Piddington's 2007 new major movie, *The Killing of John Lennon*.

Released eight albums with major European Orchestras.

Pioneered the recording of music samples on film locations with **Realms of the Russian Bear** as well as championing the use of ethnomusicological research to assist the Natural History score (**Land of the Eagle, Wildlife on One** and **The Natural World**).

Introduced the BBC Natural History Unit to the large scale orchestral palette of East European orchestras for Natural History. (*Alien Empire* and *Battle of the Sexes*.)
